Programme Objectives include:

- support delegates in developing a direction for their future career and the next step for promotion to leadership
- facilitate discussion of different styles and the effectiveness of approaches to leadership *in a time of constant change*
- provide the opportunity for delegates to experience different school contexts to see what leadership looks like

Programme Outcomes for delegates include:

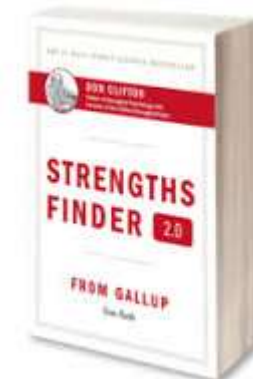
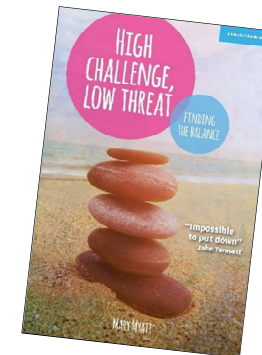
- be sure of their strengths and areas for development
